

Rosie began life in a PA puppymill, living 4 years in a wire cage that cut into her feet...

An inspector from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture saw Rosie's raw and infected paws and decided to get her out of her cage, out of the puppymill and into rescue where she could get the veterinary care she desperately needed yet had never received. Maryland Westie Rescue took Rosie and placed her in a foster home, and before too long a loving couple saw Rosie and decided to adopt her. Numerous surgeries on her paws followed, and vet bills mounted into the thousands. That's when they

turned to WestieMed for help, and found it. In no time, Rosie began to blossom. And now she speaks for herself: "When I first came to my new home, I was very timid and afraid... My Momma and Poppa have been very patient and good to me. They give me lots of love. They take me for car rides and I can watch TV with them and play outside. Now, I even walk on my hind legs when I get excited!"

Since inception, WestieMed continuously has maintained a positive cash flow and has established an exemplary record in its ability to fund eligible cases.

To ensure that demand for future financial aid will continue to be met, WestieMed is responsible for the ongoing development of funding sources. The Board of Directors works year round on establishing and implementing numerous fundraising efforts to protect and maintain the organization's viability. Throughout 2009, these efforts included solicitation of individual contributions, club and group

donations and donations of in-kind

items. During the year, several artists donated graphics through WestieMed's Artists to the Rescue program for fundraising purposes. The Board also sponsored eBay auctions and a preholiday Raffle. WestieMed's online Gift Shop and CafePress store offered a wide variety of Westie-themed products throughout the year. The Board continued to offer fundraising opportunities through its affiliates program and supported Westie Walks held for the benefit of WestieMed in various locations throughout the country. The Pedigree Foundation awarded a grant to WestieMed during 2009.
